As with all ETFs, Fund shares may be bought and sold in the secondary market at market prices. The market price normally should approximate the Fund's net asset value per share (NAV), but the market price sometimes may be higher or lower than the NAV. The Fund is new with a limited operating history.

Islamic religious law commonly known as Sharia has certain restrictions regarding finance and commercial activities permitted for Muslims, including interest restrictions and prohibited industries, which reduces the size of the overall universe in which the Fund can invest. The strategy to reduce the investable universe may limit investment opportunities and adversely affect the Fund's performance, especially in comparison to a more diversified fund.

Risks specific to SPRE: A real estate investment trust (REIT) is a security of a company that invests in real estate, either through real estate property, mortgages and similar real estate investments, or all of the foregoing. The Fund is expected to be concentrated in REITs. Through its investments in REITs, the Fund is subject to the risks of investing in the real estate market, including decreases in property revenues, increases in interest rates, increases in property taxes and operating expenses, legal and regulatory changes, a lack of credit or capital, defaults by borrowers or tenants, environmental problems and natural disasters. It is not possible to invest directly in an index. Investments in emerging markets may be more volatile and less liquid than more developed markets and therefore may involve greater risks.

Risks specific to SPUS: Equity securities, such as common stocks, are subject to market, economic and business risks that may cause their prices to fluctuate.

Risks specific to SPSK: Investments in foreign securities may involve risks such as social and political instability, market illiquidity, exchange-rate fluctuations, a high level of volatility and limited regulation. Investing in emerging markets involves different and greater risks, as these countries are substantially smaller, less liquid and more volatile than securities markets in more developed markets. Sukuk are financial certificates that are similar to conventional bonds but are structured to comply with Sharia law and its investments principles, which, among other things, prohibit charging or paying interest. Because no collateral is pledged as security for sukuk, purchasers of sukuk are subject to the risk that an issuer may not meet its payment obligations or that an underlying asset may not perform as expected or lose value. There may be times when the market is illiquid and it is difficult for the Fund to make an investment in or dispose of sukuk.

SPUS is the first Halal ETF licensed by the S&P 500. It follows AAOIFI standards and is offered on the New York Stock Exchange.

SPSK provides investors with the opportunity to invest in halal fixed income investments, offering decreased exposure to duration risk and interest rate risk. Sukuk are asset backed certificates that derive income through leases. This fund seeks to track the investment results, before fees and expenses, of the Dow Jones Sukuk Total Return Index. SPSK is the world's first and only Sukuk ETF. It is offered on the NYSE and is licensed by the S&P Dow Jones Indices (S&P DJI).

SPRE provides value exposure to the real estate asset class through Shariacompliant REITs which meet screening requirements. It tracks the S&P Global Shariah All REIT Capped Index which includes all Sharia-compliant constituents of the S&P Global REIT and offers a strong potential for income and price returns, capital preservation and inflation hedging.
